### **Notes to the Church and Congregation:**

**TRANSFIGURATION SUNDAY IS FEBRUARY 23.** This festival marks the end of the Time After Epiphany and the lead up to Ash Wednesday and Lent. The children will be saying farewell to Alleluia, we will burn our Palm Sunday palms to make ashes after the service on Sunday. *Please bring your palm fronds from last year's Palm Sunday Celebration.* Worship will be at 9:30 am and breakfast at 11 am.

SHROVE SUNDAY – After the Burning of the Palms on Transfiguration, the Youth and Worship committees invite you to a special Shrove Sunday breakfast. The menu will include pancakes with an assortment of toppings provided by WELCA. Come and enjoy breakfast with us before our Lenten fast begins!
